GoTriangle is a family of services that works together to promote sustainable transportation and provide useful resources, including:

- A transit Trip Planner
- Transit maps, fares and alerts
- Guides to biking and walking in the Triangle
- Telework and condensed work weeks
- Rideshare matching and vanpool leasing

-  **Durham Area Transit Authority (DATA):** Durham
-  **Wolfline:** NC State University
-  **Triangle Transit:** Connecting Raleigh, Durham, Chapel Hill, RTP, Apex, Cary, Garner, Hillsborough, Knightdale, Wake Forest, Wendell, Zebulon and RDU Airport

Bikes on Buses

Most area buses are equipped with two, easy-to-use bike racks on the front of each vehicle. Be sure to tell the bus driver if you need to get your bike!



Park-and-Ride

If you don't live near a bus route, try one of more than 20 free Park-and-Ride lots conveniently located throughout the region. Check out the Park-and-Ride section on gotriangle.org.



Emergency Ride Home

Join the Emergency Ride Home program so you're never stuck at work if the unexpected happens! You'll get a free voucher for a rental car or taxi ride home on days when you use transit. Sign up at gotriangle.org.

Tips on Riding Transit

Before you get on:

- Find the bus stop closest to you. Signs are marked with the routes that serve the stop.
- Call GoTriangle at 919-485-RIDE (7433) for schedule information. If calling from a bus stop location, give the agent the system name, route number and your destination for the most accurate schedule information.
- Arrive 5 minutes early to your stop, and as your bus approaches, signal to the driver so they know to stop. When it's dark, wear light-colored clothing so the operator can see you.
- Make sure you have exact change for your trip. Have your fare or bus pass ready when you board.

Once you're aboard:

- Before your stop comes up, press the rubber strip or pull the cord near the window to signal the driver to stop.
- To exit the bus, use the rear doors when possible. Never cross in front of a bus unless it is stopped at a red light.

Sign up for bus rider alerts at gotriangle.org/alerts to have info on detours and schedule changes at your fingertips.

Accessibility Services

Most transit buses are wheelchair accessible and offer talking-bus features for the visually impaired. Disabilities that prevent riders from using public transit may qualify to ride a Paratransit service. Ask Your Employer

Check with your employer for commuter benefits including discounted transit passes and vanpool fares. The GoPass, which allows commuters to ride transit for free, is offered by select employers in the Triangle.

Fare Guide

Fares vary from system to system. If you need to ride multiple systems on your trip, buy a regional pass. You'll save money if you purchase a multi-day pass. For details on any system or to buy a pass online, visit gotriangle.org.

Children, seniors, disabled persons and Medicare card holders receive fare discounts on all transit systems. VA disability card holders qualify for discounts on some systems in the GoTriangle family of services. Call 919-485-RIDE (7433) or visit gotriangle.org for details.
